Vaccination Centre – Access Information

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<p>Where is this vaccination centre?</p>	<p>Haddington Vaccination Clinic is located within Haddington Corn Exchange.</p> <p>The address is:</p> <p>13 Court Street Haddington East Lothian EH41 3DS</p>
<p>How do I find this vaccination centre?</p>	<p>Our reception staff are located within the main hall at the far end, which is directly in front you as you access the building via the small vestibule.</p> <p>As you enter the front entrance you will come into a small vestibule. There is one door on the left which is open where you can access face masks and hand gel. Follow the green floor covering to the reception desk which is at the end.</p>
<p>How can I get to this vaccination centre?</p>	<p>The clinic can be accessed by walking or wheeling via Court Street.</p> <p>The closest national cycle routes are Route 76 and Route 196.</p> <p>Travel by bus is available via the following services:</p>

	<p>From Cockburnspath – Borders Buses 253 From North Berwick – Eve 121 From Dunbar – East Coast X7 From Edinburgh – East Coast X7 From Tranent – Prentice 109 From Edinburgh via Musselburgh & Prestonpans - Prentice 111</p> <p>If travelling by car, follow the signs to Haddington. The clinic is signposted from the road with yellow road signs from all approach routes. The vaccination centre is situated between The Plough Tavern and John Muir House, directly opposite The Royal Bank of Scotland and Home Hardware.</p>
<p>Is there a quiet room or private space?</p>	<p>There is a private space that can be used for vaccinating. Please speak to the receptionist when you arrive.</p> <p>Prior arrangement would be beneficial in advance of your visit, but we will accommodate you however we can.</p>
<p>Is this vaccination site wheelchair accessible?</p>	<p>Access to the Vaccination Centre is wheelchair accessible.</p>
<p>What toilet facilities are available?</p>	<p>There are toilet facilities, including an accessible toilet. They are located through the left-hand door at the top of the main room. Staff can help direct you to these facilities.</p>
<p>Are there hearing loops in use?</p>	<p>There are no hearing loops at this Vaccination Centre.</p>
<p>Are assistance dogs welcome?</p>	<p>Assistance dogs are welcome at every Vaccination Centre. If you need any additional support, please speak to a member of staff who will be happy to help.</p>
<p>What are the parking arrangements?</p>	<p>There are no racks for bicycles to be chained to at this location.</p> <p>The nearest car parking facilities are free of charge and are at the rear of the building.</p> <p>There are 2 spaces reserved for those with disabilities.</p>

<p>Can I attend my appointment at this site with a friend, family member or carer?</p>	<p>Yes, we are happy to accommodate your visit with anyone who makes you more comfortable, although we would advise limiting this to one other person where possible. We do accommodate for families with children.</p>
<p>Are there interpretation services?</p>	<p>Yes, all clinics can provide telephone interpretation services. Please let the vaccinator or a member of the team know which language you require.</p> <p>For verbal interpretation, a call will be made to The Big Word service where you and your vaccinator will be connected to an interpreter.</p> <p>You do not need to arrange this in advance of your visit.</p>
<p>Can I arrange a BSL interpreter for an appointment?</p>	<p>Yes, please call the Vaccination Enquiries Helpline before your visit on 0300 790 6296 or email loth.vaccenquiries@nhslothian.scot.nhs.uk to request the assistance of a BSL interpreter. A member of the Translation and Interpretation Team will help to arrange this for you. This needs to be pre-arranged before your appointment.</p>
<p>Are the doors automatic?</p>	<p>No, there are no automatic doors. There are two sets of doors – the outside and inside will both be ajar during appointment times.</p>
<p>Can I arrange the assistance of a sighted guide?</p>	<p>Yes, please call the Vaccination Enquiries Helpline before your visit on 0300 790 6296 or email loth.vaccenquiries@nhslothian.scot.nhs.uk to request the assistance of a sighted guide.</p> <p>A member of the Translation and Interpretation Team will help to arrange this for you.</p>
