Vaccination Centre – Access Information

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Where is this vaccination centre?	Musselburgh Vaccination Centre is located inside Musselburgh Primary Care Centre. The address is: Musselburgh Primary Care Centre Inveresk Road Musselburgh EH21 7BP
How do I find this vaccination centre?	The clinic is on the ground floor and is close to the main entrance, on the right-hand side as you enter the building.
How can I get to this vaccination centre?	The clinic can be accessed by walking or wheeling via Inveresk Road.
	The closest national cycle route is Route 76.
	The clinics can be reached using the following bus services:
