	If entering the main entrance, turn left at the main concourse and the vaccination centre will be on your left-hand side.
How can I get to this vaccination centre?	The clinic can be accessed by walking or wheeling via the Corstorphine / South Gyle Path.
	The Gyle Centre can be reached by the following bus services: 400, 300, 36, 22, 21, 12 and 2.
	The Gyle is also accessible by tram.
