Purpose of the role	NHS Lothian Charity's Tonic Arts Programme has a collection of over 2500 artworks, the vast majority of which are on display across NHS Lothian sites.
	To maximise the impact of the art collection and to preserve its value, the Tonic Art Collection Volunteers carry out regular inspections of the displayed art and, if they choose to, lead/support engagement activities for patients, staff and visitors.

Tasks to be undertaken	 Check artwork & frames for signs of damage/ wear and tear. Record the condition of the artwork, making detailed notes of any damage. Flag/code the art works according to damage Check the art work's interpretation label to ensure it is both present and correctly branded. Record any issues with interpretation label. Document the artworks checked & upload image of any damage/ issues to artwork/ frame/ label. Additionally, volunteers can choose to support engagement with the collection by; Leading or supporting tours of collection works Having conversations with individuals using spaces where works are displayed Supporting workshop activities connected to the collection Distributing engagement materials to those in the spaces where works are displayed
